	Reception's Curriculum
Literacy	This half term our book is 'We're Going On a Bear Hunt'. We will be learning the story and creating our own actions as we go through. We will be writing lists of things to take with us on our Bear hunt adventure. We will be writing a description of the bear and we will consider other places that we might pass through when on our bear hunt. As well as our class book we will also be observing our eggs and chicks and filling in an observation book. We will continue to look at writing in sentences and the key features of a sentence we need to include in our work.
Maths	This half term we will be recapping on the numbers learnt so far and then starting with number 13. Each week we will be working on a different number, visiting measure, money, shapes and patterns and the language associated with position and direction and really consolidating what each number means. We will also have a special focus on one more and one less.
Knowledge and understand ing of the world	Our bear hunt book will lead us on to find out about different bears and where they live, looking on a World map. We will learn about hibernation and talk about the different types of animals that hibernate during the Winter and why. We will also learn about the life cycle of chicks through real life observation. On 4 <sup>th</sup> March we will be having an incubator and eggs in our classroom and we will be keeping a close eye on them to see them hatch. How 'eggciting' will this be?!
RE	This half term we will further our knowledge of Christianity and think about the question- 'where do we belong?' Thinking about the special places in our community. We will also look at the story of Easter.
PE	This half term we have a great opportunity to work with a drama teacher. We will be 'acting' based on the Bear Hunt story. We will also have Forest School to develop our confidence in moving and climbing in the dell area.
PSHCE	This half term we will continue to address the current news with the children and interpreting this discussing how it impacts on our lives. Each week we will have a whole school focus on a thought of the week. This will link to our core British Values which are: rule of law, democracy, tolerance, individual liberty and mutual respect.
Expressive arts	This half term we will be creating sound effects for the different settings found in the Bear Hunt story. We will create collages of the different settings. Science	This half term, Year 4 will be investigation Solids, liquids and Gases. They will use their scientific knowledge to carry out an investigation.
RE	This term's topic looks at the question 'What are we prepared to sacrifice?' This learning will link with the Christian celebrations of Lent and Easter.
MFL	Last half term, we did not cover the French that we had planned, therefore we will continue to work on last half terms learning.
PE	This term, the Year 3/4 children will have the opportunity to go down into The Dell and enjoy an afternoon developing their gross motor skills The Year 4/5 children will continue with their weekly swimming lessons. Additionally, the children will also take part in weekly netball lessons, working on the skills of the game before taking part in matches.
PSHCE	This half term, we will be addressing current news with the children and interpreting this; discussing how it impacts on our lives. Each week, we will have a whole school focus on the 'Thought of the Week'. This will be linked to our core British Values, which are: Rule of Law, Democracy, Tolerance, Individual Liberty and Mutual Respect.

## Year 5's Curriculum

English	In English this half term, Year 5 will continue to learn about play script Using our new drama tuition, the children will have the opportunity to account some of their ideas. Keep your eyes on Seesaw to watch how the confidence progresses.
Maths	During Maths lessons, Year 5 will be focusing on decimals. To begin the term, we will recap on the place value of decimal numbers before comparing numbers. Once the children are confident, we will begin to add and subtract decimals. To support learning at home, I will place a range of games on Seesaw for the children to play.
Science	Working scientifically, Year 5 will be exploring properties of materials. The children will learn: how to categories materials, using scientific vocabulary; the difference between reversible and irreversible changes and how to test a material's properties using scientific methods.
Computing	To ensure that we are able to display our work effectively, this term will focus on how to effectively use PowerPoint and word. Once the children can use the software, they will be creating their own books.
RE	What are we prepared to sacrifice?  This half term we will be looking at the key question in relation to Christianity. At the end of the term, Class 5 will consider sacrifices they have made and how it has made them feel.
PE	In PE this term the children will be continuing to build on their swimming skills during weekly lessons at the centre. On a Friday afternoon, Class Five will also take part in netball lessons with Mrs Slonecki- focusing on attacking and defending.
Торіс	In topic this term we will continue to study the Stone Age to Iron Age era. The children will explore how the lifestyle of early humans changed through the discovery of new materials.
PSHCE	Each week the children will participate in a range of PSHCE lessons linked to the British values.
French	We will begin the term by revising colours and body parts. Once the children are confidence with their pronunciation, writing and reading of this key vocabulary, they will create a Chatter Pix describing their own appearance.

	Year 6's Curriculum
English	As we thought, in the last term we didn't get time to work on our Biography unit, so this term we will! We will be looking at the way we can present information to allow the reader to be informed and entertained. We will be continuing our reading of the Wolf Brother book in Guided Reading, as well as looking at the different question types we may be asked in our upcoming SATs.
Maths	This term, we are moving onto word problems and then a longer unit on measures. We will be focussing on conversation of units and how to calculate area, perimeter and volume.
Topic	Changes in Britain since the Stone Age
•	This term, we continue on our exciting journey into the changes that happened in Britain since the Stone Age. We will be looking at cave paintings and foraging for our own paint materials, as well as looking at and recreating Stone Henge.
Science	Evolution
	This term sees a continuation of our topic on Evolution and specifically looking at how the Human Race has evolved over time. We will be researching Charles Darwin's Theory of Evolution and how animals have adapted to their environments.
RE	This term's topic continues with our 'Is Life a Journey' theme by focussing on saying sorry and answering the question 'Can saying sorry change things?' We will be looking at this in our own lives as well as how the Christian church teaches the importance of forgiveness through parables.
MFL	Vocabulary Building
	With so many Healthitude sessions last half term, we did not cover as much French as we hoped. So this half term we will look at colours and body parts such as <i>jambe</i> .
PE	Dance
	This half term, our PE stays to a Tuesday as we spend the afternoon looking at the skills necessary to creating a piece of dance to a given piece of music. We will look at how to express emotion with our bodies.
PSHCE	This half term, we will be addressing current news with the children and interpreting this; discussing how it impacts on our lives. Each week, we will have a whole school focus on the 'Thought of the Week'.
