<u>Wider Curriculum</u>

Year 3/4/5 Norton Priory

As part of their history topic on Victorians, the children thoroughly enjoyed taking part in two workshops at Norton priory. In the first workshop the children took part in an interactive Victorian School experience, some unfortunate children had to place their fingers in finger stocks to stop them from fidgeting. The children also worked together to make butter and this was followed by experiencing a Victorian PE lesson where they learnt a dance. In the second workshop the children explored artefacts from Victorian life, including toys, household appliances and clothing. The children also learnt all about Norton Priory itself.

<u>Runcorn Fire Brigade</u>

As part of Year 2's history topic on The Great Fire of London, the fire brigade came into school so that the children could compare how the first service has changed since 1666. The children loved exploring the fire engine and they asked lots of interesting questions.

As part of EYFS People Who Help Us Topic, the children enjoyed learning all about the fire engine and the the firefighters uniform and how it keeps us safe and them safe. The children loved the fact that they left the playground with flashing lights and sirens!

Key Stage 2 Mental Health Family Workshop

It was lovely to have 15 families join us for a range of activities encouraging discussion on their mental health and wellbeing. The families worked with their children completing brain gym, mindful colouring, matching facial expressions to emotions and making worry monsters. Due to the success of this we are looking at booking in another workshop for our children/families.

<u>Children's Mental Health Awareness Week</u>

This final week of the term the children have been completing work linked with the theme 'My Voice Matters.' Year 2 have looked at how it is important to listen to each other by looking at body language and recognising that there are different ways to express themselves. Lewis Carrol class have been looking at how your emotions can impact on behaviour and have explored different strategies to support this. Reception class have read 'Ruby's Worry' and discussed how it is important to share their emotions. It was lovely to see our children express themselves through their clothing today.

<u>Safer Internet Day</u>

Our Key Stage 2 Computing Ambassadors, delivered an assembly all about this years theme of inspiring change. The classes then completed a variety of activities linked to staying safe online. Year 5 looked at how AI can be used to enhance and support people's carers, they also compared this with the negatives. Year 3 created a poster with top tips on how to stay safe when playing games online.

<u>HPAN</u>

The whole school worked together to create our 'What a Wonderful World' exhibition. Each class produced artwork linked to the story The Oak Tree. The exhibition is now open in the Town Square, Runcorn Shopping City. We also need to say well done to our Year 6 children who sang beautifully to officially open the exhibition.
