When we have one of something it is called the <u>singular</u>.

When we have two or more of something it is a <u>plural</u>.

Two coats, lots of dogs, the children, three wishes

Expectations

In year 1, children should be writing simple sentences using sentence punctuation. Children should be using their understanding of known sounds to write words focusing on good letter formation. Pupils will be able to sequence sentences to create short stories.

End of sentence punctuation

Full stop

Most sentences end in a full stop.

My name is Lucy.

That car is red.

Exclamation Mark

Exclamation marks show that someone is shouting.

Wow!

Be careful!

Question marks

We use a question mark when someone asks a question.

What is the weather like?

How are you?

We can use 'and' to add extra words to our writing.


