CURRICULUM

THE SCHOOL WILL:

deliver a balanced and carefully planned curriculum which meets the needs of your individual child;

keep you informed of topics the children will be learning;

offer specialist music tuition during the school day;

offer a range of extra-curricular activities (including educational visits).

BEHAVIOUR

THE SCHOOL WILL:

make sure the children are familiar with the school rules;

use rewards and sanctions fairly;

HOMEWORK

THE SCHOOL WILL:	I INTEND:
set appropriate homework regularly;	to help my child find a quiet place and time to do homework;
mark homework that is returned on time;	to support my child with homework, informing the class teacher of any difficulties;
keep parents informed of homework that is set;	to help my child return homework on time;
make arrangements to change reading books.	to read to and with my child frequently.

ATTENDANCE and PUNCTUALITY

THE SCHOOL WILL:

start the school day promptly at 8.55 a.m.

only hand over children in years R - 3 to their parents(at the end of the day unless authorised to do otherwise;

maintain an accurate record of attendance;

contact parents when a child does not attend school.

I INTEND:

to make sure that my child is at school regularly and on time;

to make suitable arrangements for my child to be collected, by an adult aged 18 or over, on time at the end of the school day (children in years 5- 6 may walk home with written permission in Year 5);

to provide a letter explaining any absences;

to contact the school promptly when my child is absent.

WELFARE and COMMUNICATION

THE SCHOOL WILL:

ensure that the children are safe on the school premises and when on educational visits;

Administer long term prescribed medication with written permission and a care plan

give full and clear information about the curriculum and your child's progress;

communicate with parents frequently.

I INTEND:

to make sure the school always has an up-to-date emergency contact number; to ensure that children do not wear i.e. jewellery for school

to keep my child at home when unwell;

to raise any concerns with my child's class teacher as early as possible;

to ensure my child goes to bed at a suitable time during the week.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES

THE SCHOOL WILL:

try to enable all children to take part in all activities;

use different cultural examples in our teaching;

ensure that bullying and racist, sexist and other discriminating behaviour is not tolerated. I INTEND:

to help my child understand that everyone is of equal importance;

to encourage my child to appreciate and respect the views and religions of others.
