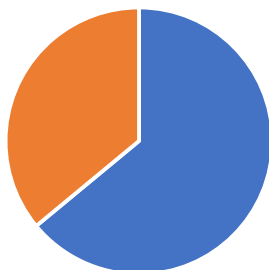
Whole School Reading

36% of PP children achieved ARE in Reading.

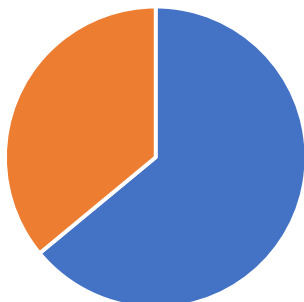
Whole School Writing

29% of PP children achieved ARE in Writing.

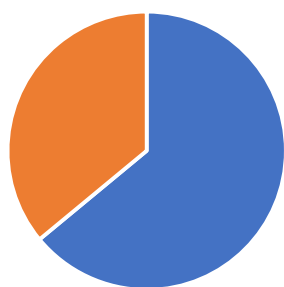
Whole School Maths

Reading Progress



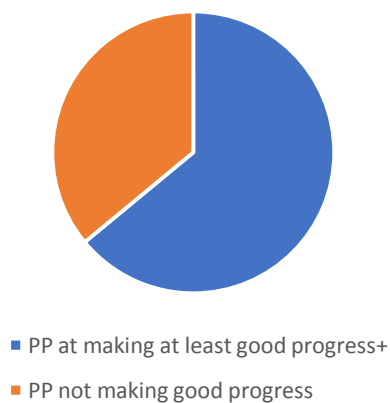
93% of PP children achieved expected progress in Reading.
