Forest Schools:

Mrs Forshaw says that Y1 children have worked hard during forest school sessions. I have really been impressed with the way they have developed their teamwork skills. Reception have had great fun taking part in Forest schools this half term. The children have loved getting covered in mud and enjoyed exploring the Dell area, finding different ways of moving through and around the trees. We even had a camp fire and toasted marshmallows.

Allotment:

The children have continued to enjoy the weekly visits down to the allotment where they have harvested a range of foods, which have been used in a variety of ways. The children have begun planting a small crop for harvest next year and will continue work on the allotment up to the Christmas holidays.

Flotsam

All of the classes have used Flotsam by David Wiesner as a stimulus for their English and Topic work, the school has been a hive of activity and it has been lovely to see all of the children determined to produce a very high standard of work for display.

<u>Year 6</u> have worked hard writing balanced arguments and Craft Club have risen to the challenge of making 3D octopus from fabric. The have loved using the sewing machine to stitch their creations together and can't wait to show them off in the Year 6 section of the Flotsam display. Year 5 have developed their use of figurative language and used this to create waves! They have also completed some sketching and diary entries. Year 4 have immersed themselves in the Flotsam story. In English, the children have produced engaging setting descriptions and tantalising shape poetry. Exploration of the topic has continued within their afternoon classes where they have investigated rivers and the causes of flooding Year 3 have been working extremely hard to adapt to KS2. The children have worked very hard writing stories and poems all linking to our story Flotsam and they have created some amazing art work that will all be displayed in our soon to open sensory walk. Year 2 have blown Miss Gaunt away in English with their amazing, creative stories which are now displayed around the school, they have worked really hard improving our handwriting, grammar skills and spellings. Thank you so much to everyone who has supported the creation of our fantastic whole school Flotsam display, the children are very proud of their work being part of a whole school project. Year 1 children have worked very hard to produce some amazing work for our Flotsam display. They have shown wonderful creativity in both their artwork and writing. Year R have worked on their letter formation and creating a range of impressive art work, including a giant starfish!
